Secretary's Report

AGM - Elections and Other important Issues

The AGM was conducted at the Broadford RSL on 19 October 2024. Elections were held for the positions of Vice-President, Secretary, Recruiting/Membership Manager, Special Projects 1 and all State Representatives. Present incumbents all nominated for their positions, and as there were no further nominations, were elected unopposed.





Association Gatherings - \$10 per Association Member Subsidy
