Cambrai Day Parade - Adelaide 11 November 2022

The leadership of the Association was absolutely thrilled when the Regiment extended an invitation to Association Members as well as all other veterans, (who had served in any capacity with the Regiment), to actively participate (march with the Regiment) in the Cambrai Day Parade at approximately 1700 hours on Friday 11 November 2022. It is understood that Association Members and Veterans will lead the Regiment on the Parade. Those who may not be able to march should still be able to actively participate. All participants, including spectators are invited to participate in the post parade function until 10:00 pm.

What an incredible opportunity and such an honour!

Family members are also able to attend as spectators. All Parade participants and spectators are required to register with Event Brite (https://www.eventbrite.com/e/1st-armoured-regiment-cambrai-parade-tickets-394178046147) to ensure access to the RAAF Edinburgh precinct.

Associations Functions

The Association has committed to conducting a Meet and Greet function on Thursday 10 November 2022, and a Recovery Brunch/Lunch on Saturday 12 November 2022. Both functions are to be conducted at the Mawson Lakes Hotel (Function Centre) which is located approximately 15 km from Edinburgh. Both events are open to Association members and non-members with an expected cost of around \$35 for the Meet and Greet and \$20 for the Recovery Brunch/Lunch. Non-members could be expected to pay an additional \$5 for each event. Registration and prepayment for each event is essential so that appropriate catering may be organised.

Sporting Scholarship

No applications for the Sporting Scholarship have been received to date.

Membership – Current Situation

As at 2 September 2022, the Association has a total of 487 active (financial) members; an increase of around 108 since the AGM held on 14 July 2018 when the majority of the current Management Committee was elected.

Membership renewals – there were 213 members due for membership renewal on 1 February 2022. So far 191, or 90.1% have renewed with one (1) member resigning by email, one (1) who has suspended membership for 12 months and a further 22 who have failed to renew. Attempts to contact these members, by email and phone, have been unsuccessful. We have not yet given up and hope that the odd friendly phone call may have a positive result.

In accordance with the Constitution, these 22 members are now classified as 'Inactive - Resigned' and are to be removed from the Association's mailing (both email and snail mail) lists within the next week. However, such members may renew their membership at any time without any difficulty. Any member who may be experiencing 'financial hardship' should contact the Secretary for a confidential discussion and possible extension of membership.

The Association has recently experienced significant difficulties contacting individual members with gmail accounts. It is believed that this situation has been rectified in the last day or so, but testing continues. Prior to removing the above members from the mailing lists, one more attempt to establish contact is to be made.

Association Recruitment Manager

Dick Stanios has recently volunteered to undertake the role of Recruitment Manager. A Zoom meeting in approximately two weeks should formalise the role of our new Recruitment Manager as well as establishing a plan to attract new members and encouraging previous members to renew their memberships and/or re-join the Association.

PM22 Reunion - Finalisation of Accounts

At present it is not possible to close of the accounts for the Reunion due to a refund to be paid to the Association by Rydges. The Association was required to pay for all expected attendances and alcohol consumption up front. Due to some late minute cancellations (primarily due to COVID) and mildly restrained drinking at the Reunion Dinner, a refund of a thousand dollars or so is expected.

Cambrai Day (Adelaide) 2022 - Subcommittee - in accordance with governance requirements, a Subcommittee, consisting of Mark Reid, John Brooker, Werner Golla and Russ James, was established to oversee the arrangements and functions in Adelaide over the period 10 to 12 November 2022. Terms of Reference for this Subcommittee are to be issued shortly.

Awards at the School of Armour

Awards presented to the Student of Merit for the ROBC (Tank) course, Subject 4 Crew Commander (Tank) and Tank Gunnery courses had not occurred due to COVID. A budget, not to exceed \$400 per annum, has been approved for awards of statuettes/figurines. This arrangement is to be formally locked in with the School of

The School of Armour requested that the Association examine the feasibility of donating Honour Boards for the three (3) courses mentioned immediately above. Costs for acquiring the boards, as well as the lettering, are to be obtained and discussed at the next Management Committee meeting (September). Any volunteer, skilled in the construction of Honour Boards, would be welcomed very warmly!

Health/Welfare Fund

The Association currently has a health/welfare fund of approximately \$1,275. This money was contributed by DVA through the RAAC Corporation. The funds may only be used for health/welfare purposes. It was agreed at the Management Committee meeting that the sum of \$400 be donated to the Tasmanian Vietnam Veteran's Retreat for the acquisition of a First Aid Kit and additional medical supplies.

Credit Card Facility

The Secretary advised that investigations had commenced into the use of a credit card facility (Stripe) that

would allow members to pay their membership fees and Q Store purchases using a credit card. It seems that this facility existed as far back as 2013/14 but suspended for some reason. A decision to implement such a facility, including integration with the Association's accounting software (Xero), will be referred to a full meeting of the Management Committee.

RSM's Message

The 1st Armoured Regiment

'Through the mud, and the blood, to the green fields beyond', words that epitomise the spirit of our Regiment. They are indicative of the service that has been faithfully provided by all, regardless of Corps, to our Regiment since inception.

It has been sometime since a piece has been written for our association members and much of that is due to the tempo of the Regiment for the last few years. Since the tragic bushfires that ravaged our nation in 2019 to severe flooding along the east coast to the pandemic that continues to devastate the globe, the officers and soldiers of the Regiment have provided continuous support to serve their nation.

The officers and soldiers of our Regiment have been able to demonstrate one of the key components of the Australian soldier, empathy and compassion for those desperately in need. We have been there to embrace those whom have lost everything; we have been there to help the grieving family deal with loss of all their possessions, home and effects handed down through generations, and also been there to help them deal with the loss of life. You couldn't be more proud of the achievements of our officers and soldiers.

The Regiment remains at the forefront of the Army's ability to respond to threats to our nation. Our armoured platforms are critical to the fabric of the combined arms team. Throughout this extremely busy period of support to Domestic Operations, every effort to build the fundamentals of our Regiment and train for warfighting has been made. We have returned to collective field training on our vehicles which has been critical in terms of 're-sharpening the sword' after such a prolonged period of disruption to training. We are about to embark upon another field deployment to the Northern Territory where, for the first time in a while, we will form Battlegroup Lion and will augment forces from Australia, Malaysia and the United States.

C Squadron is currently undertaking a rotation through Butterworth where the majority of the dismounted cavalry skillset is being tested in some very trying conditions. On return they will form the Regiment's Light Cavalry Squadron and convert on to the Hawkei light protected mobility vehicle. Regular commitments of our Cavalry Troops to Operation RESOLUTE ensure that the skills that our personnel have are put to good use on the defence of our nation.

Our support personnel, the 'truckies', the 'spanners', the 'que-ees' and the clerks, who are forever providing for us all that is required to complete our mission. Without them, the Regiment stops.

Our officers and soldiers continue to excel on courses, representing our Standard at all times with exemplary performances. Nearly every course attended result in a Student of Merit by those from our Regiment, or a very notable achievement.

In October, our Regiment and the 7th Battalion, the Royal Australia Regiment, will transition from the 1st Brigade to the 9th Brigade. The 9th Brigade will be comprised of a combination of Regular and Reserve units and this change will mark another significant event in our unit history.

For the first time in over three years, the Regiment will be able to hold a mounted Cambrai Parade where we formally recognise before family and friends, achievements of the officers and soldiers and display our vehicles with pride in what I promise as the RSM, to be quite a spectacular parade. For the first time, we will be inviting veterans, old and new, to march on to the parade with us as a mark of respect and appreciation for those who have gone before us and to provide an opportunity for connection with back to Regiment.

Australian Bureau of Statistics (ABS) Census Information from DVA

The following information has been received from DVA with results from the recent census that was conducted last year.

Those who reported to have served or are serving in the Australian Defence Force (ADF). Some key insights from that data are:

- 581,100 people advised that they had served in the ADF. This is 2.8 per cent of the Australian population (aged 15 years and over).
- Overall, about 40 per cent of those who reported to being veterans in the census are DVA clients.
- 41 per cent of male veterans and 36 percent of female veterans in the census are DVA clients.
- Queensland has the highest veteran population at 163,133. Of this, 75,975 (47 per cent) are DVA clients.
- Victoria has the lowest veteran population at 105,225. Of this, 33,929 (32 per cent) are DVA clients.
- Townsville has the most currently serving persons, and the most who have ever served. Approximately 66 per cent of those in Townsville who have served are DVA clients.

Attached for your reference is a presentation expanding on some of these early insights deduced from the 2021 census population data. The presentation also includes a breakdown of the local government areas in each state and territory with the highest number of veterans and serving members.

The census data stories have being progressively released by ABS since 28 June 2022.
