### Secretary's Report

### Management Committee Meeting - 17 March 2023 via Zoom

General business included discussion on:

- a. Honour Boards for School of Armour (SOA). At that time, the Association was waiting on information from the School concerning the type of Honour Board required. Latest update is that photos of existing Honour Boards have been obtained, preliminary costings obtained from Burgess Signs in Seymour, wording for each of the Honour Boards is being determined and when finalised will be sent to SOA for sign-off as well as preparation of names of Students of Merit back to 2007.
- b. There was general discussion concerning the advantages and disadvantages of various options for the future disposition of ARN 169005. Since then, the Federal Budget has been released and all funding for a rebuild and move of the Museum has been reallocated. Our Tank is unlikely to move to a new location in the medium term. The Management Committee has proposed a new longer-term loan to the Museum. The Disposition Team has been placed on 'leave' for the immediate future.
- c. The Vice-President (Dean Martin the 'spanner') advised that merchandise sales increased significantly when new items or designs were released in conjunction with major events such as the Port Macquarie Reunion and the Adelaide events of November 2022.
- d. The Secretary advised that a Birthday Lunch (74<sup>th</sup>) was being planned for the Broadford RSL on 8 July 2023. Update 42 people have now registered for the lunch, but it is not too late if you wish to attend. Email the Secretary!

### **Membership – Current Situation**

As at 3 July 2023, the Association had a total of 499 active (financial) members with a further 11 members who were due to renew their membership on and after 1 February 2023. Reminder Notices have been despatched via snail mail and email.

In accordance with the Constitution, these 11 members are now classified as 'Inactive' and do not have any voting rights. Those that fail to renew by 1 August 2023 will be classified as 'Inactive – Resigned'.

### Association Gatherings - \$10 per Association Member Subsidy

At the Management Committee held on 21 July 2021, a motion was passed that the Association would provide a subsidy of \$10 per head for gatherings of members in regional/remote areas to subsidise the cost of the meal. This was later amended to include all gatherings of Association members, whether in regional/remote areas or not. In recent times, this subsidy has been paid to offset direct members costs for a lunch at Richmond (Tasmania), at the Adelaide Cambrai Day 2022 events, at the Victorian Long Lunch and Tolmie Camping Trips.





# **REGIMENTAL NEWS**



The Regiment's Adjutant, CAPT Benjamin Peterson, has again furnished us with a SITREP of unit activities conducted since the last edition.

The Regiment has been busy from March through June with the work-up, deployment and return from Exercise Paratus Walk in Cultana Training Area being the main training event. Before this, the Regiment conducted EX STEEL LION which saw a simulation exercise being conducted at Chauvel Lines involving all SQNs.

ANZAC Day saw multiple catafalque parties deployed far and wide around the state, as well as a Regimental March through the Adelaide CBD with the remainder of 9 Brigade. Following ANZAC Day, C SQN deployed into Cultana East first and conducted a training progression from individual through to Troop live-fire assessments and Troop dismounted Anti-Armour practices — of note the first element within Army to do either using the Hawkei vehicle.

A, B and SPT SQN deployed into Cultana West and conducted training progressions from individual through Troop live-fire assessments also. At the back end of May, C SQN came 'over the road' and the Regiment conducted a Battlegroup live-fire with four Combat Team live-fires over three days.

Finally, the CO and RSM travelled up to Darwin recently to attend Battle of Binh Ba commemoration events with 5RAR, but also collect the first Standard and Guidon of the Regiment. These will be ceremonially relocated to St Peters Cathedral in North Adelaide on the 8th of July. As a side note, all former members of the Association, family friends and associates are invited to the relocation of these devices.




